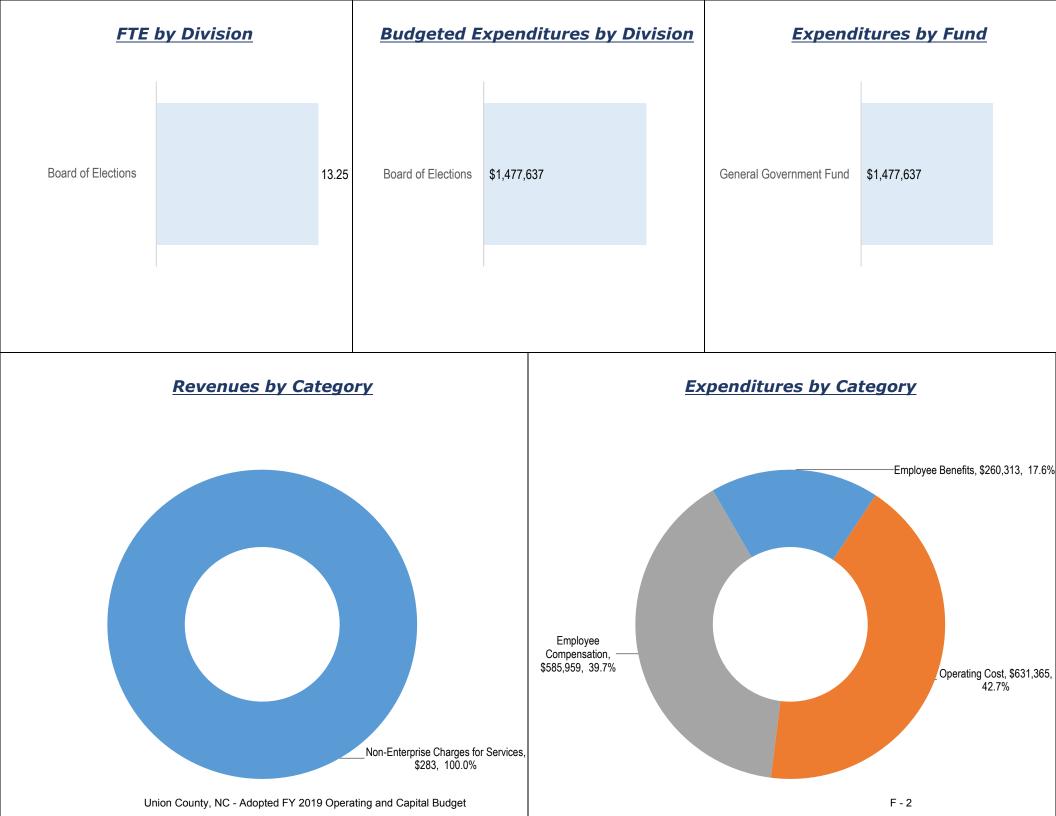

Service Area Analysis

There are currently 52 Election Day precincts and seven early voting sites in Union county and voter registration increased 41.5 percent in the last decade to over 150,000 County registered voters. Board of Election is expanding from three precincts to four in FY 2019 and will be adding an additional board member as a result.

Some year over year changes include the conversion of one Regular Part Time Absentee Ballot Coordinator to one Full Time Employee position (\$8,861) and increase of temporary and part time wages for mid-term election poll workers.
