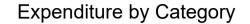

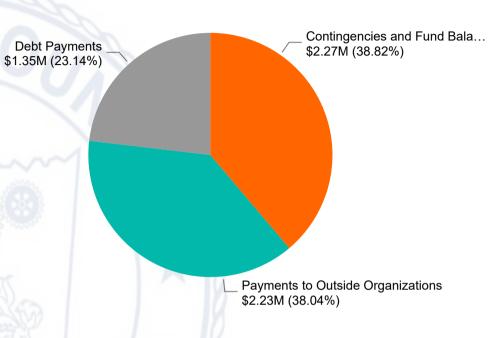

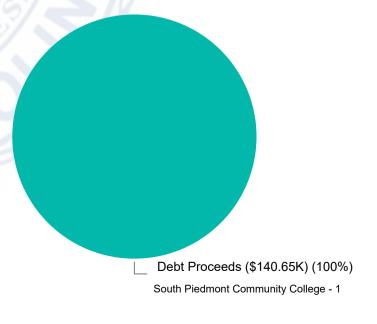

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Department Mission

Department Services Provided

SPCC offers career and technical programs, continuing education classes, health programs, early college programs for high school students, workforce readiness programs, etc.

Department FY 2020 Discussion

In recent years, the County has invested significantly in South Piedmont Community College. The increased investments have allowed the college to continue buildout of the Tyson Family Center for Technology and ongoing funding for one facility maintenance and one IT support position. It is recommended that the County continue this investment by maintaining funding levels for staffing, operating and information technology in the amount of \$2,226,709.

Department Analysis

The 7.3 percent decrease in total expenditures is related an increase in debt service of \$924,110 and direct support (\$152,323), and a decrease to fund balance contribution of (\$1,534,826). The BOCC has adopted grant match funding and will provide 50 percent county funding (\$40,000) for a Career Coaching position to be placed in multiple county high schools.

In the fall of 2016, the voters approved a bond referendum providing for the construction, renovation, improvement, equipping and furnishing of facilities for South Piedmont Community College and the acquisition of land or rights-of-way if necessary. As a result, the required debt service payment on these project bonds is estimated at \$1,354,969.
