BACKGROUND: G.S. 160A-266 provides for the disposition of real or personal property by 1)private negotiation and sale; 2)advertisement for sealed bids; 3)negotiated offer, advertisement, and upset bid; 4)public auction; or 5)exchange. Recent legislative changes expanded the disposition of property through public auction to include an electronic auction procedure.

GovDeals provides services to government agencies that allow them to sell surplus items via an Internet-based electronic auction system. Historically, Union County has used the public auction procedure exclusively. Adding the electronic auction procedure will provide us an additional tool to help maximize the revenue produced from disposal of surplus property.

The City of Monroe is currently using GovDeals with great success as evidenced by a substantial increase in their surplus proceeds. We believe Union County will experience the same. This agreement is not exclusive, and Union County may continue to use the other disposal procedures as deemed appropriate.

I. Scope of Work

The NC Legislature has allocated additional funding to expand the BCCCP services. The scope of work for the state BCCCP money changes to include the following:

Target:

A. The target is to reach 29 additional women with the use of the money during the period November 1, 2007 through May 31, 2008.

Priority Populations:

- A. The priority population for NBCCEDP mammography services is women between the ages of 40 and 64 who are low-income (250% of federal poverty level or less), who have not been screened in the past year.
- **B.** The priority population for NBCCEDP cervical cancer screening services is women between the ages of 18 and 64 who have low-incomes (250% of federal poverty level or less), who have never been screened or not been screened in the past five years.

All the requirements of the original BCCCP AA remains in effect.

- II. Performance Indicators and Benchmarks No change.
- III. Reporting Requirements- Patients seen using state funds need to be tracked and reported separately from those seen using federal BCCCP money.
- IV. Consequences of inadequate performance (require corrective action plans, withhold payment, reduce or eliminate funding/payment).

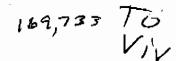
