Union County, North Carolina IFB No. 2022-068 Union County Jail Body Scanner

Sealed bids for a Union County Jail Body Scanner will be received by the Union County Procurement Department *until* *10:00 AM local time on June 28, 2022 at the Union County Government Center, 500 North Main Street, Suite 709, Monroe, NC 28112. The public bid opening will be conducted outdoors, in the front entrance area of the Union County Government Center at the specified bid date and time. <u>Late bids will not be accepted</u>.

On June 28, 2022, beginning at *9:30 **AM** local time, bids will be received by the Union County Procurement Department at the bid opening location, outdoors in the front entrance area of the Union County Government Center at 500 North Main Street, Monroe, NC 28112.

Union County, North Carolina, through the Union County Sheriff's Office, is soliciting bids from qualified companies for a High Security Body Scanner for the Union County Jail, as described in this solicitation.

If a Bid is sent by mail or other delivery system, the sealed envelope containing the Bid shall be enclosed in a separate package plainly marked on the outside with the notation "**BID ENCLOSED** – **2022-068**" and shall be addressed to Union County Procurement Department, Attn: Vicky Watts, 500 North Main Street, Suite 709, Monroe, NC 28112.

This solicitation follows the Uniform Administrative Requirements (UG), Cost Principals, and Audit Requirements for Federal awards (2 C.F.R. Part 200). Contracts resulting from this solicitation may be funded with federal grant funds which have been procured in a manner that is in compliant with all applicable Federal laws, policies, and standards as well as state law and local policies.

The County intends to pay, in part or in whole, the cost of the contract resulting from this solicitation, using monies received from the Fiscal Recovery Funds (including, without limitation, the Interim Final Rule (86 Fed. The public bid opening will be conducted outdoors, in the front entrance area of the Union County Government Center at the specified bid date and time. Late bids will not be accepted.

On June 28, 2022 beginning at *1:30 **PM** local time, bids will be received by the Union County Procurement Department at the bid opening location, outdoors in the front entrance area of the Union County Government Center at 500 North Main Street, Monroe, NC 28112.

Union County reserves the right to reject any or all Bids, to waive technicalities and to make such selection deemed in its best interest. Union County, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to supplement, amend, substitute or otherwise modify this IFB at any time, to cancel this IFB with or without the substitution of another IFB, and to issue additional request for information.

3.3 BID QUESTIONS

Bid questions will be due on or before <u>June 20, 2022 at 10:00 AM</u> local time. The primary purpose of this is to provide participating Bidders with the opportunity to ask questions, in writing, related to the IFB.

Should an Offeror find discrepancies or omissions in this IFB or any other documents provided by Union County, the Offeror should immediately notify the County of such potential discrepancy in writing via email as noted above.

Any addenda to these documents shall be issued in writing. No oral statements, explanations, or commitments by anyone shall be of effect unless incorporated in the written addenda. Receipt of Addenda shall be acknowledged by the Offeror on $\underline{\mathsf{Appendix}}\ \underline{\mathsf{D}} - \mathsf{Addendum}\ \mathsf{and}\ \mathsf{Anti-Collusion}\ \mathsf{Form}.$

4 FUNDING

Union County has received a payment from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund or Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund established pursuant to Sections 602 and 603, respectively, of the Social Security Act, as added by Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2 ("ARPA").

The County intends to pay, in part or in whole, for the cost of the contract resulting from this solicitation using monies received from the Fiscal Recovery Funds. In using these funds, the County must comply with the terms of ARPA, regulations issued by the U.S. Department of the Treasury governing the expenditure of monies distributed from the Fiscal Recovery Funds (including, without limitation, the Interim Final Rule (86 Fed. Reg. 26,786 (May 17, 2021) and Final Rule (87 Fed. Reg. 4,338 (Jan. 27, 2022)), the Award Terms and Conditions applicable to the Fiscal Recovery Funds, and such other guidance as Treasury has issued or may issue governing the expenditure of monies distributed from the Fiscal Recovery Funds (collectively, the "Regulatory Requirements").

The County must comply with the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, 2 C.F.R. Part 200, other than such provisions as Treasury has determined or may determine are inapplicable to the Fiscal Recovery Funds.

Pursuant to 2 C.F.R. § 200.327, the County must include within the Contract applicable provisions described in Appendix II to 2 C.F.R. Part 200. Therefore, the County cannot enter into a Contract or make any distributions of funds to Contractor using monies from the Fiscal Recovery Funds absent Contractor's agreement and adherence to each term and condition contained therein.

5 INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 COMMUNICATIONS

All communications, any modifications, clarifications, amendments, questions, responses or any other matters related to the IFB must be made only through the Procurement Contact noted on the cover of this solicitation. A violation of this provision is cause for the County to reject a Company's bid. No contact regarding this document with other County employees is permitted and may be grounds for disqualification.

5.2 BIDDERS ACKNOWLEDMENT

The Bid will remain subject to acceptance for 90 days after the Bid Opening, or for such longer period of time that Bidder may agree to in writing upon request of Owner.

5.3 DUPLICATE BIDS

No more than one (1) bid from any Bidder will be considered by the County. In the event multiple bids are submitted in violation of this provision, the County will have the right to determine which bid will be considered, or at its sole option, reject all such multiple bids.

5.4 BID SIGNATURES

An authorized company official must sign Bids. Each signature represents binding commitment upon the Bidder to provide the goods and/or services offered to the County if the Bidder is determined to be the lowest responsive, responsible Bidder.

6 PURPOSE

6.1 COUNTY

Union County, North Carolina (population 242,657) is located in the central, southern piedmont. The County provides its citizens with a full array of services that include public safety, water/wastewater utilities and sanitation, human services, cultural and recreational activities, and general government administration.

6.2 INTRODUCTION

Union County, North Carolina, through the Union County Sheriff's Office, is soliciting bids from qualified companies for a High Security Body Scanner for the Union County Jail as described in this solicitation.

7 SCOPE OF WORK

The purpose and intent of this solicitation is to describe a piece of equipment known a high security, walk through, body scanner for use in the Union County Jail. The scanner should rapidly and non-intrusively, scan individuals entering the secure facility to inspect and identify those who are attempting to conceal contraband items on or inside their bodies.

The equipment furnished must be new and the manufacturer's latest listed and published stock model, or models which meet all the applicable requirements of these specifications. The Body Scanner shall be the most current production model at the time of delivery and shall conform to the minimum specifications outlined in this solicitation. All parts and attachments not specifically listed, but which are

necessary to furnish a complete ready-to-work unit, shall be provided. All manufacturers' standard equipment for the model shall be provided and delivered complete to the Union County Sheriff's Office.

8 SPECIFICATIONS

The following specifications and requirements are incorporated around equipment the Sheriff's Office has evaluated and determined necessary for the equipment requested by this solicitation. Bidders are requested to offer Body Scanners which will provide the features and performance needed and implied. Refer to Appendix A – Specifications Form to acknowledge the following requirements:

- 1. Compact footprint (not to exceed 36" by 72" by 80");
- 2. Body temperature reading capabilities;
- 3. Variable scanning dosage
- 4. Meets ANSI-HPS N42-17-2009 regulations;
- 5. Touch screen monitor;
- 6. Windows based system;
- 7. Image storage capacity;
- 8. Transportable;
- 9. Gray scale;
- 10. 110V/15 A;
- 11. Infrared scanners:
- 12. Install and calibration of unit;
- 13. On site operator training;
- 14. Warranty on parts and labor of system to begin at customer acceptance;
- 15. Quick scanning time; scanning time of less than 10 seconds is preferred;
- 16. Variable Scanning Doses from .25 uSv to 2.5 uSv/hour radiation level;
- 17. Materials detected but not limited to the following: metals, ceramics, plastics and powders;
- 18. Compliance with American National Standard N43.17-2009, Radiation. Safety for Personnel Security Screening Systems;
- 19. Person being scanned does not move (stationary images);
- 20. Must be delivered either completely pre-assembled or be able to be assembled in the existing space where unit be used;
- 21. Must be proven to detect the following contraband:
 - a. Knife or weapon of any type or kind;
 - b. Tool(s);
 - c. Money;
 - d. Drugs/medication & Illegal drugs;
 - e. Pens:
 - f. Tobacco products;
 - g. Matches;
 - h. Lighters;
 - i. Intoxicants;
 - j. Jewelry;
 - k. Razor blades;
 - Metal paper clips/staples, etc.

- 22. No floor anchors:
- 23. Transportable thru any 35"wide and 82" high doorway;
- 24. High resolution image with no distortion;
- Pinpoint object location based on anatomy;
- 26. <150,000,000 Gray Scales Levels in first image;
- 27. The radiation "Restriction Zone" does not exceed the actual footprint of scanner;
- 28. No warm-up period required for x-ray generator;
- 29. All subject photos are saved with each scan for evidence and downloadable onto a separate storage drive;
- 30. Electrical requirements does not require a dedicated circuit;
- 31. Complete head to toe full body scan;
- 32. Touch Screen Monitor with stand; video image must large enough to be easily viewed (please state dimensions and resolution);
- 33. Framework needs to be sturdy; describe materials and installation.

8.1 VENDOR RESPONSIBLILITES

Vendor must acknowledge and respond to the following on Appendix A – Specifications Form:

- Manufacturer specifications for the Body Scanner must be included with the bid package;
- 2. Certification(s) documentation must be included with the bid package;
- 3. Bid should include warranty and specifics on what the warranty includes;
- 4. Bidder must include information about power requirements;
- 5. Bidder must include software and upgrades as part of warranty;
- 6. Bidder must include weight and dimensions of scanner;
- 7. Bidder must provide information on any software or scanner updates.

8.2 **DEVIATIONS**

Any deviations from specifications and requirements herein must be clearly pointed out by bidder on Appendix A – Specifications Form. Otherwise it will be considered that products offered will be in strict compliance with these specifications and requirements, and successful bidder will be held responsible therefor. Deviations must be explained in detail on an attached sheet. However, no implication is made by Union County that deviations will be acceptable. Bidder is advised that the response (or lack thereof) on this question does not take precedence over specific responses or non-responses provided elsewhere in this bid.

8.3 SPECIFICATIONS FORM

The specification form is located in **Appendix A** of this solicitation. <u>This form must be completed and submitted with the bid package.</u> Failure to submit Appendix A – Specifications Form will be grounds for disqualification.

8.4 DELIVERY

All Bids shall include all delivery and/or freight charges to the address specified in this document. No additional freight shall be charged at time of delivery. Risk of loss and/or damage shall be upon the seller until such time as goods have been physically delivered and received by the County.

9 EVALUATION OF BIDS AND AWARD PROCEDURES

9.1 BID INFORMATION

Bids must be made in strict conformance using the Invitation for Bid (IFB) forms provided herein. All blank spaces for bids must be filled in properly. Numbers must be written in ink or typewritten, and the completed forms shall be without erasures, lineation, or alterations. In accepting the bid, the County will assume that no alterations have been made, and if they appear afterward, they shall not be binding on the County.

All Bid Documents shall be signed by an individual who is authorized to contractually bind the company. The signature must indicate the title or position the individual holds in the agency or firm. Agencies or firms which sign contracts with the name of the agency or firm must provide the name of a corporate officer or executive director for signature validation by the County. All unsigned Bids will be disqualified. In submitting a Bid, Offeror affirms all statements contained in the bid are true and accurate.

9.2 BID SUBMISSION FORMAT

Bids must include the following:

9.3 TERMS OF SUBMISSION

All material received from a person or company ("Respondent") in response to this solicitation shall become the property of Union County and will not be returned to the Respondent. Any and all costs incurred by a Respondent in preparing, submitting, or presenting submissions are the Respondent's sole responsibility and Union County shall

not reimburse the Respondent. All responses to this solicitation will be considered a public record and subject to disclosure under applicable public records law.

Any material in a response which the Respondent considers a trade secret and exempt from disclosure as a public record under applicable law, including N.C.G.S. §§ 132-1.2 and 66-152, must be properly designated as a trade secret. In order to properly designate such material, the Respondent must: (i) submit any trade secret materials in a separate envelope, or file, from all other submitted material, being clearly marked as "Trade Secret – Confidential and Proprietary Information," and (ii) stamp the same trade secret/confidentiality designation on each page of the materials therein which contain trade secrets.

To the extent consistent with public records law, Union County will make reasonable efforts to maintain the confidential nature of trade secrets, as determined by Union County and subject to the conditions set forth herein. Respondent understands and agrees by submitting a response to this solicitation, that if a request is made to review or produce a copy of any information in the Respondent's materials which was properly labeled by the Respondent as a trade secret, Union County will notify the Respondent of the request and the date that such materials will be released to the requestor unless the Respondent obtains a court order enjoining that disclosure. If the Respondent fails to obtain the court order enjoining disclosure prior to that date, Respondent understands and agrees that Union County will release the requested information to the requestor on that date.

Furthermore, the Respondent also agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Union County and each of its officers, employees, and agents from all costs, damages, and expenses incurred in connection with refusing to disclose any material that has been designated as a trade secret by Respondent.

9.4 AWARD

The award shall be made to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, taking into consideration quality, performance, and the time specified in the bid for the performance of the contract

A Bid may be rejected if it is incomplete. Union County may reject any or all Bids and may waive any immaterial deviation in a Bid.

More than one Bid from an individual, firm, partnership, corporation or association under the same or different names, will not be considered.

The award document may incorporate, by reference, all the requirements, terms and conditions of the solicitation and the Bidder's Bid as negotiated.

The County shall have a period of 60 days after opening of Bids in which to award the contract. A Purchase Order/Contract shall serve as the agreement for the purpose of this award. Contents of the Bid shall become contractual obligations if a contract ensues. Failure of the Bidder to honor these obligations may result in cancellation of the award.

9.5 APPLICATION OF NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTES

The General Statutes of North Carolina regarding purchasing and competitive bidding (G.S. § 143-129) are made a part herein and will govern the bidding process as applicable.

10 GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

10.1 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR BIDDERS

Bids shall be considered only from companies normally engaged in providing the type of equipment specified in this solicitation. Union County, in its discretion, shall determine whether the evidence of responsibility and ability to perform is satisfactory.

The individual/firm warrants that he/she is fully qualified, with adequate personnel and experience, to undertake the services required. The Offeror shall also certify that insurance coverage that meets or exceeds industry standards for this type of work will be in force to mitigate risk during performance under the contract.

10.2 PURCHASE OF ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT

Subject to the successful bidder's acceptance, Union County reserves the option to purchase additional equipment as specified herein at the price bid and awarded in this Invitation for Bids within one (1) year from bid execution date. This bid may also be utilized by other entities per N.C.G.S. to piggyback at the sole discretion of the vendor.

10.3 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

All payroll taxes, liability and worker's compensation are the sole responsibility of the Offeror. The Offeror understands that an employer/employee relationship does not exist under this contract.

The County reserves the right to reject any and all bids, the right to waive informalities, and the right to disregard nonconforming or conditional bids or counter bids. It is the intention of Union County to execute a final, binding Contract with the successful Offeror which incorporates terms and conditions no less onerous than those appropriate to the engagement of a licensed contracting firm in connection with a project of this magnitude.

All bids submitted in response to this request shall become the property of Union County and as such, may be subject to public review.

10.4 IFB EXPENSES

Expenses for developing the bids are entirely the responsibility of the vendor and shall not be chargeable in any way to the County.

10.5 CERTIFICATION

In response to the IFB Request, the Contractor certifies the following:

- This bid is signed by an authorized representative of the firm;
- It can obtain insurance certificates as required within ten (10) calendar days after notice of award;
- All labor costs, direct and indirect, have been determined and included in the proposed cost;

• The potential Contractor has read and understands the conditions set forth in this solicitation.

10.6 FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The Bidder must have the following financial information readily available and have the ability to provide it to the County, without exception, within twenty-four (24) hours upon request during the bid certification process:

- 1. Annual audited financial reports for the past five (5) fiscal years;
- 2. Credit reports, credit bulletins, bank and vendor references, and any other
- 3. published statements by agencies that have been issued or published about the entity within the past five (5) years;
- 4. Indicate whether the Company (and/or predecessor, guarantor, or subcontractor) has declared bankruptcy within the last five (5) years;
- 5. Provide a description of the financial impact of any past or pending legal proceedings and judgments that could materially affect the Bidder's financial position or ability to provide service to the County.

10.7 CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

The contents of this Bid and the commitments set forth in the Bid shall be considered contractual obligations, if a contract ensues. Failure to accept these obligations may result in cancellation of the award. All legally required terms and conditions shall be incorporated into final contract agreements with the selected Service

10.8 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Seller represents and warrants that the performance of this order and the furnishing of goods or services required shall be in accordance with the applicable standards, provisions and stipulations of all pertinent Federal, State or County laws, rules, regulations, resolutions and ordinances including but not limited to the Fair Labor Standards Act, the Equal Employment Opportunity rules and regulations and the Occupational Safety and Health Acts.

10.9 SUB-CONTRACTOR/PARTNER DISCLOSURE

A single Company may propose the entire solution. If the Bid by any Company requires the use of sub-contractors, partners, and/or third-party products or services, this must be clearly stated in the Bid. The Company submitting the Bid shall remain solely responsible for the performance of all work, including work that is done by sub-contractors.

10.10 MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BID

Prior to the scheduled closing time for receiving bids, any Contractor may withdraw his bid. After the scheduled closing time for receiving bids, no bid may be withdrawn for 90 days. Only written requests for the modification or correction of a previously submitted bid that are addressed in the same manner as bids and are received by the County prior to the closing time for receiving bids will be accepted. The bid will be corrected in accordance with such written requests, provided that any such written request is in a sealed envelope

that is plainly marked "Modification of Bid." Oral, telephone or fax modifications or corrections will not be recognized or considered.

10.11 CONTRACT COMMENCEMENT

Commencement of a contract shall not begin prior to all necessary County approvals, including County Commission approval where required, and receipt of a County Purchase Order. Commencement of a contract without these approvals is solely at the Bidder's own risk and is likely to result in no payment for services performed or goods received.

10.12 DISPUTES

In case of any doubt or differences of opinion as to the services to be furnished hereunder, the decision of the County shall be final and binding upon both parties.

10.13 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

All Companies will be required to follow Federal Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) policies. Union County will affirmatively assure that on any project constructed pursuant to this advertisement, equal employment opportunity will be offered to all persons without regard to race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, and marital status, status with regard to public assistance, membership or activity in a local commission, disability, sexual orientation, or age.

10.14 MINORITY BUSINESSES (MBE) OR DISADVANTAGED BUSINESSES (DBE)

It is the policy of Union County that Minority Businesses (MBEs), Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) and other small businesses shall have the opportunity to compete fairly in contracts financed in whole or in part with public funds. Consistent with this policy, Union County will not allow any person or business to be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be discriminated against in connection with the award and performance of any contract because of sex, race, religion, or national origin.

10.15 LICENSES

The successful Firm(s) shall have and maintain a valid and appropriate business license (if applicable), meet all local, state, and federal codes, and have current all required local, state, and federal licenses.

10.16 E-VERIFY

E-Verify is the federal program operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security and other federal agencies, or any successor or equivalent program, used to verify the work authorization of newly hired employees pursuant to federal law. Offeror/Firm shall ensure that Firm and any Subcontractor performing work under this contract: (i) uses E-Verify if required to do so; and (ii) otherwise complies with applicable law.

10.17 INSURANCE

One or more of the following insurance limits may be required if it is applicable to the project. The County reserves the right to require additional insurance depending on the nature of the agreement.

At Contractor's sole expense, Contractor shall procure and maintain the following minimum insurances with insurers authorized to do business in North Carolina and rated A-VII or better by A.M. Best, or as otherwise authorized by the Union County Risk Manager.
