Question/Answer

1. **Question:** Will a bond be required for this contract?

Answer: No.

2. **Question:** What is the average number of concrete repair projects that the Public Works Dept. generates per year?

Answer: Estimated 200.

3. **Question:** Page 4 of the RFP document states that the county reserves the right to award multiple vendors. Do you anticipate this contract to be awarded to a principle vendor with “backup” vendors or would there be multiple vendors acting on a rotation for calls?

Answer: Goal is to have one and maybe a backup.

4. **Question:** Page 24 Section B addresses 6” and deeper concrete repair. Is there a limit to deeper? It will be hard to estimate the amount of material needed if a depth is not known.

Answer: All are less 6” 99% of the time, most are 4”,select fill may be used if any deeper.

5. **Question:** Page 24 Section C addresses 2’-6” concrete curb and gutter. This section asks for a LF price only. Will there be an option to price a minimum or flat rate for small repairs? A LF price that covers mobilization costs for small repairs (e.g. 0-10 LF) would not accurately scale for larger repairs.

Answer: There will be no option for a minimum or flat rate for small repairs. Submit pricing based on the scope of work listed in RFP 2022-079 using the Appenidx A - Price Form located on page 24.

6. **Question:** Are the average curb and gutter repairs a certain size or don’t exceed a certain size?

Answer: Most are less than 15 feet.
