# Overview of ARPA



# American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

- Signed into law March 11, 2021
- Established Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (CSLFRF) Program
- Provide support to State, territorial, local and Tribal governments in responding to the economic and public health impacts of COVID-19
- Union County received \$46,589,799
- Administered by U.S. Department of Treasury

# Eligible Use Categories\*

- Respond to COVID-19 or its negative economic impacts
- Respond to workers performing essential work during COVID-19 through premium pay to employees or grants to employers (through April 10, 2023)
- Provide government services to the extent of reduction in revenue due to COVID-19
- Make necessary investments in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure

<sup>\*</sup> Enumerated uses under each category

#### **Prohibited Uses**

- Pension funds
- Borrow money or make debt service payments
- Rainy day funds or other financial reserves
- Satisfy obligations from a legal judgement

#### **Award Terms and Conditions**

- Uniform Guidance Requirements
  - Cost Principles
  - Procurement, Suspension and Debarment
  - Program Income
  - Property Management
  - Subaward Monitoring
  - Special Tests and Provisions
- Other Requirements
  - Record Retention
  - Single Audit
  - Civil Rights

# Timeline of Actions



#### 2021

- June 21 Board approved accepting 1st tranche of ARPA funds
- August 31 Board received presentation from UNC School of Government and Recovery Act Committee
- November 1 Board received staff recommendations for general funding allocations
- November 15 Board approved funding allocations as follows:
  - COVID-19 Mitigation 10%
  - Strategic Investments in County Services 70%
  - Community & Economic Support 10%
  - Administration 5%
  - Hold-Back 5%

# 2022 – 1st Quarter

February 7 – Board approved staff recommendations for specific project funding allocations as follows:

# 2022 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter

- April 4 Board received information from staff on eligible projects for water infrastructure
- April 11 Board tabled discussion on ARPA funding recommendations for water infrastructure projects and directed staff to bring back alternative recommendations
- April 18 Board received staff recommendations on alternative project recommendations and approved the following projects:

Crime Lab**	\$1,000,000
Short-Term Fire Training Needs**	\$1,500,000
Public Safety Training Center**	\$4,500,000
Broadband	\$7,325,000
Southwest Regional Library**	\$3,500,000

# 2022 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter (cont'd)

May 16 – Board approved staff recommendations for additional small projects as follows:

Underwater Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV)*	*\$87,000

✓ June 6 – Board accepted the 2<sup>nd</sup> tranche of ARPA funds and approved Grant Project Ordinance for all projects, associated Capital Project Ordinances for capital projects and Indian Trail Waterline (\$400,000)

# 2022 – 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter

September 6 – Board approved staff recommendations to use revenue replacement and restoring public sector capacity on salaries and benefits to fund ARPA-enabled projects as follows:

Aseptic Training Facility**	\$ 4,900,000
Farmer's Market Upgrades**	\$ 1,700,000
Yadkin Project Parallel Distribution Line	\$10,000,000
Well Testing and Rehabilitation	\$ 300,000
Broadband	\$ 1,500,000

September 22 – Board approved amended Grant Project Ordinance for all projects and amended Capital Project Ordinances for capital projects

# 2023 – 1st Quarter

- February 20 Board approved including the use of unspent ARPA funds for 12-Mile Creek WRF Expansion in the Water and Sewer Capital Plan for financial rate model planning purposes (\$16,000,000)
- March 6 Board approved using unspent ARPA funds for Crooked Creek Interceptor Expansion Project (\$16,000,000)

# Recommendations and Next Steps

- Amend the Grant Project Ordinance and associated Capital Project Ordinances for approval at next regular meeting
  - Add the Crooked Creek Interceptor Project as a Direct ARPA Project (\$16,000,000)
  - Remove the following Direct ARPA and ARPA-enabled projects due to timing issues, anticipated availability of other funding sources or no longer pursuing
    - Yadkin Project Parallel Distribution Line \$10,000,000
    - Public Safety Training Center \$ 4,500,000
    - Farmer's Market Improvements
      \$ 1,700,000
  - Move the Indian Trail Waterline to an ARPA -enabled project (\$400,000)

# Recommendations and Next Steps

- Appropriate the ARPA investment earnings at the next regular meeting and use a portion of those funds to purchase a grants management system for approval at a future meeting
  - Increase efficiency by automating manual processes to track grant applications, issue awards, monitor spending progress, and report on outcomes
  - Enhance data management by integrating data from grant applications and awards with our financial management system
  - Ensure compliance with grant requirements and, such as reporting deadlines, spending requirements, and program goals
  - Improve collaboration across departments managing different aspects of our grants
