Union County, North Carolina Request for Proposals No. 2024-051 Vending Machine Services

Electronic proposals will be received by the Union County's Procurement Department at the Union County Government Center, 500 North Main Street, Monroe, NC 28112 until <u>11:00 AM Local</u> <u>Time on April 11, 2024.</u> Late submittals will not be accepted.

Union County, North Carolina, through Union County Facilities Management is soliciting proposals from experienced and qualified companies to provide vending machine services.

2 SUBMITTAL DETAILS

2.1 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION DEADLINE AND DELIVERY ADDRESS

All Proposal Submittals are to be received by the Union County Procurement Department no later than <u>11:00 AM Local Time on April 11, 2024</u> per the instructions below. Any submittals received after this date and time shall be rejected without exception.

2.2 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Select the Solicitation drop down arrow and choose this RFP from the list. Complete the form, upload your proposal, and select submit. An email will be sent to the address listed on the form as your confirmation of receipt.

The proposal package **<u>must be signed</u>** by a person who is authorized to bind the proposing Company. Instructions for preparing the proposal are provided herein.

Paper submissions will not be accepted. Submissions e-mailed directly to the Procurement Contact will not be accepted.

There is no expressed or implied obligation for Union County to reimburse Offerors for any expenses incurred in preparing proposals in response to this request.

Union County reserves the right to:

- Reject any or all proposals, to waive technicalities and to make such selection deemed in its best interest;
- Cancel this solicitation; and
- Award to multiple vendors.

2.4 PROPOSAL QUESTIONS

Proposal questions will be due on or before <u>April 1, 2024 at 2:00 PM Local Time</u>. The primary purpose is to provide participating Offerors with the opportunity to ask questions, in writing, related to the RFP.

2.5 PROPOSAL ADDENDUM

Union County may modify the RFP prior to the date fixed for submission of proposals by the issuance of an addendum.

Should an Offeror find discrepancies or omissions in this RFP or any other documents provided by Union County, the Offeror should immediately notify the County of such potential discrepancy in writing via email as noted above.

Any addenda to these documents shall be issued in writing. No oral statements, explanations, or commitments by anyone shall be of effect unless incorporated in the written addenda. Receipt of Addenda shall be acknowledged by the Offeror on <u>Appendix</u> <u>C – Addendum and Anti-Collusion</u> form.

2.6 COMMUNICATION

All communications, any modifications, clarifications, amendments, questions, responses, or any other matters related to this Request for Proposals must be made only through the Procurement Contact noted on the cover of this RFP. A violation of this provision is cause for the County to reject a Company's proposal. <u>No contact regarding this document with other County employees is permitted and may be grounds for disqualification.</u>

3 PURPOSE

3.1 COUNTY

The County (estimated population 247,058) is located in the central, southern piedmont. The County provides its citizens with a full array of services that include public safety, water/wastewater utilities and sanitation, human services, cultural and recreational activities, and general government administration.

3.2 INTRODUCTION

Union County is seeking proposals from qualified firms to obtain a contract to provide vended snack and beverage products for Union County facilities: Government Center, Operations Center, Agricultural Center, Simpson Events Center, Progress Building, Judicial Center, Libraries, and Health & Human Services. It is possible that other County facilities may wish to add vending machines.

4 SCOPE OF WORK

4.1 BASIS OF AGREEMENT

The basis of this agreement is the use of Union County facilities and utilities, by the successful bidder, for the provision of various types and sizes of vending (snack and drink) machines for County employees and the public. In lieu of compensation at a percentage

commission rate against total gross sales, the County will accept compensation as a lower price point on products sold.

This should in no way be construed as the County buying any service. The successful bidder shall be responsible for the payment of all taxes, permits, fees, etc., of any nature, to include but not be limited to sales tax, excise tax, use tax, and any other types existing or to be added at a future date.

The only interest the County shall have in this agreement is the negotiation of a lower product cost in exchange for the contractor's use of County space and utilities, and the monitoring of the contract to insure its smooth administration.

4.2 OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS

It is intended that in the performance of this contract that there be no delivery charges, handling charges, or any cost to the County.

Reports

Contractor shall submit a monthly report as specified by the County on all items on which contractor shall have made sales during that period and such information shall become open to the public. Said report must be either on computer-generated forms (Excel Spreadsheet preferred), or typed on pre-printed forms; in no event shall a handwritten report be allowed.

Successful bidder is to supply a list of equipment by location, after installation, showing type of machine and serial number. The County will assume absolutely no liability of any kind for machines. It is the responsibility of the vendor to obtain that protection deemed necessary to protect its interests.

4.3 TERM OF AGREEMENT

This agreement shall continue in full force and effect for a period of three (3) years with two (2) one (1) year options from the commencement date.

4.4 VENDOR QUALIFICATIONS

In order to be considered qualified for award of this contract, a vendor must have certain minimum qualifications as given below. Please provide a brief summary of your firm that addresses these issues.

- 1) Vendor must have a minimum of five years' experience in the provision of vending machine services.
- 2) Vendor must have adequate insurance coverage, as defined by page 18.
- Vendor must provide three (3) acceptable references to Union County. These references should be for vendor's customers that are close to the size and scope of this contract.
- 4) Vendor must have adequate personnel on staff that can service this contract.

5) Vendor must have the capital necessary to support this contract for the five-year period.

4.5 USE OF UNION COUNTY FACILITIES

Successful bidder shall agree to the following:

- 1) To make no other use of the designated premises than the purpose for which is outlined in this RFP.
- 2) To operate first class vending machines at all County facilities. All initial equipment shall be new; no refurbished equipment will be accepted.
- 3) To keep vending machines at all Union County locations properly stocked and operational for business from the hours of 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday, excluding County holidays and weekends.
- 4) To abide by all applicable Federal, State, or local laws, regulations or ordinances concerning the operation of vending machines as described in this RFP.

4.6 UTILITIES AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Union County will provide electricity, lighting, heating, and air conditioning of designated premises, but without liability on Union County's part arising from temporary interruption thereof on account of breakdown, power failure or like causes. Successful bidder agrees that in the use of such utilities, they will exercise the same degree of care and economy as would be exercised if they were paying for such utilities. This contract does not include any needed cleaning of the vending machines.

4.7 PRODUCT DESCRIPTION AND PRICING

Please provide a complete listing of the products you would sell through the given machines and the price you would charge for each item. If awarded this contract, the quoted product pricing will be used for the first three years of this contract.

The resale prices quoted for product shall be firm for the first three (3) years. After this period, the contract price for product may be increased annually by the last announced increase in the CPI Index for all Urban Consumers, Wage and Clerical Workers, Southeast region. All price increases shall be subject to approval of County.

Refunds

Bidders must submit in writing their refund procedure. This procedure is to be used when a customer has a problem with a vending machine.

Product Service

All dated products must be removed from machines no later than the "stale date" shown on the product. If product is habitually sold past the sale date, this may be cause for termination. Additionally, if a manufacturer of products has a recall and those items are not replaced immediately, this may be cause for termination.

5 DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES DESIRED

5.1 SERVICING TIME

All machines shall be serviced daily (Monday through Friday), on call, and/or as needed or specified by Union County. The bidder shall state approximate time of day for servicing of machines. Successful bidder shall check in with designated contact at each location each time machines are services. Designated contact will be supplied to the successful bidder upon award. All of the contractor's employees shall be uniformed for ease of identification. Successful bidder shall be on call at all times during normal business hours, with a response time of not more than two (2) hours to service or repair machines that are not working properly.

5.2 EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

- SNACK MERCHANDISER: Showcase style machine for a variety of snack items, gum, mints, etc. Machine must have built in bill changer, accepting \$1 and \$5 dollar denominations.
- COLD DRINK MERCHANDISER: Unit must have at least eight (8) different selections. The machine must have built-in bill changer. Pepsi products are preferred.

NOTE: DIFFERENT MACHINES MAY BE ADDED TO OR REMOVED FROM THIS LIST AS STYLES OR CONDITIONS CHANGE.

NOTE: ALL MACHINES SHALL ALLOW FOR VARIABLE PRICING OF THE MERCHANDISE IN THAT MACHINE.

Equipment Repairs

Vendor is responsible for the cleaning, maintenance, and repair of all vending machines. In the event a machine cannot be repaired on site, a substitute machine must be provided for the duration of the repair.

Any and all equipment under this contract shall be new. All machines shall have electronic (continuous) accounting of the merchandise that is sold. The County shall determine if machines are in acceptable condition. Should a machine be unacceptable, the vendor will replace it with an acceptable machine within three (3) days.

Additions/Changes in Equipment

The County reserves the right to make changes in the number and/or type of equipment needed whenever necessary. Such changes shall be based upon increases or decreases in volume of sales or in type of merchandise offered and shall be by mutual agreement between the County and the vendor where practicable.

Locations can be added, deleted, and adjusted to meet the changing needs of the County.

6 DETAILED SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS AND INSTRUCTIONS

6.1 TERMS OF SUBMISSION

All material received from a person or company ("Respondent") in response to this solicitation shall become the property of Union County and will not be returned to the Respondent. Any and all costs incurred by a Respondent in preparing, submitting, or presenting submissions are the Respondent's sole responsibility and Union County shall not reimburse the Respondent. All responses to this solicitation will be considered a public record and subject to disclosure under applicable public records law.

Any material in a response which the Respondent considers a trade secret and exempt from disclosure as a public record under applicable law, including N.C.G.S. §§ 132-1.2 and 66-152, must be properly designated as a trade secret. In order to properly designate such material, the Respondent must: (i) submit any trade secret materials in a separate envelope, or file, from all other submitted material, being clearly marked as "Trade Secret – Confidential and Proprietary Information," and (ii) stamp the same trade secret/confidentiality designation on each page of the materials therein which contain trade secrets.

To the extent consistent with public records law, Union County will make reasonable efforts to maintain the confidential nature of trade secrets, as determined by Union County and subject to the conditions set forth herein. Respondent understands and agrees by submitting a response to this solicitation, that if a request is made to review or produce a copy of any information in the Respondent's materials which was properly labeled by the Respondent as a trade secret, Union County will notify the Respondent of the request and the date that such materials will be released to the requestor unless the Respondent obtains a court order enjoining that disclosure. If the Respondent fails to obtain the court order enjoining disclosure prior to that date, Respondent understands and agrees that Union County will release the requested information to the requestor on that date.

Furthermore, the Respondent also agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Union County and each of its officers, employees, and agents from all costs, damages, and expenses incurred in connection with refusing to disclose any material that has been designated as a trade secret by Respondent.

6.2 PROPOSAL FORMAT

<u>The County desires all responses to be identical in format.</u> While the County's format may represent a departure from the vendor's preference, the County requests adherence to the format. All responses are to be in the format described below.

Offerors should prepare their proposals in accordance with the instructions outlined in this section. Each Offeror is required to submit the proposal electronically – <u>Refer to page 4</u>, <u>item 2.2</u>. Each section should be identified as described below. Proposals should be prepared as simply as possible and provide a straightforward, concise description of the proposer's capabilities to satisfy the requirements of the RFP.

The County may award a contract based on initial offers received without discussion of such offers. A proposer's initial offer should, therefore, be based on the most favorable

terms available. The County reserves the right to contact proposers regarding cost and scope clarification at any time throughout the selection process.

The successful Offeror's proposal must include all responses to the requirements contained within this RFP and all appendices (if applicable) must be completed in their entirety.

By submitting a proposal, the successful Offeror's Offeror agrees to all applicable provisions, terms and conditions associated with this RFP. This solicitation, the successful bidder's submitted proposal, all appendices and attachments (if applicable), and stated terms and conditions may become part of the resulting contract.

Utmost attention should be given to accuracy, completeness, and clarity of content. All parts, pages, figures, or tables should be numbered and clearly labeled. Response information should be limited to pertinent information only. Marketing and sales type information is not to be included.

Omissions and incomplete answers may be deemed unresponsive. Please initial any corrections.

The proposal should be organized and identified by section as follows:

- 3. Stipulate that the proposal price will be valid for a period of 180 days.
- 4. Make the following representations and warranty in the cover letter, the falsity of which might result in rejection of its proposal: "The information contained in this proposal or any part thereof, including any exhibits, schedules, and other documents and instruments delivered or to be delivered to the County, is true, accurate, and complete. This proposal includes all information necessary to ensure that the statements therein do not in whole or in part mislead the County as to any material facts."

6.2.2 SECTION B – QUALIFICATIONS & EXPERIENCE

Include a general discussion of the proposer's overall understanding of the project and the scope of work proposed. The statement should include details on available equipment, ability to meet scheduling requirements, personnel, levels of service, and other factors the Proposer feels may impact Union County's decision.

6.2.3 SECTION C – PROPOSED STRATEGY, APPROACH, IMPLEMENTATION AND EQUIPMENT OFFERED

This section provides each vendor with the opportunity to demonstrate how its history, organization, and partnerships differentiate it from other vendors. Careful attention should be paid to providing information relevant to Union County needs.

- The proposer should demonstrate full knowledge and understanding of the project and the requirements for this type of work.

- Is the bidder's organization involved in any pending litigation that may affect its ability to provide its proposed solution or ongoing maintenance or support of its products and services.
- Provide information on the equipment being offered. Include specifications, duty cycles, warranties, etc.

6.3 SELECTION PARTICIPANTS

- 1. Maintaining the integrity of the RFP process is of paramount importance for the County. To this end, please do not contact any members of Union County or its staff regarding the subject matter of this RFP until a selection has been made, other than the County's designated contact person identified in the introduction to this RFP.
- 2. Representatives of Union County will read, review, and evaluate the RFP independently based on the evaluation criteria. Failure to abide by this requirement shall be grounds for disqualification from this selection process.
- 3. The County will establish an RFP Evaluation Team to review and evaluate the RFPs. The RFP Evaluation Team will assess the RFPs independently in accordance with the published evaluation criteria. Union County reserves the right to conduct interviews with a shortlist of selected respondents.
- 4. At its sole discretion, the Owner may ask written questions of Offerors, seek written clarification, and conduct discussions with Offerors on the RFPs.
- 5. The County reserves the right to determine the suitability of proposals on the basis of a proposal meeting scope and submittal criteria listed in the RFP. Evaluation criteria and other relevant RFP information will be used to assist in determining the finalist Vendor.

6.4 EVALUATION SELECTION PROCESS

A weighted analysis of the evaluation criteria will be utilized to determine the Vendor that represents the best value solution for the County.

In the evaluation and scoring/ranking of Offerors, the County will consider the information submitted in the RFP as well as the meetings (if applicable) with respect to the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFP.

The initial evaluation criteria/factors and relative weights listed below will be used to recommend selection of the Proposed Offeror or for the purpose of selecting Short-Listed Offerors. The County may choose to award without engaging in interview discussions.

Vendors may be invited to give a demonstration of the capabilities of the proposed solution to the Union County evaluation team. The successful bidder's demonstration (if requested), along with questions and answers, will be a critical component of the overall vendor evaluation.

After identification of Short-Listed Offerors, the County may or may not decide to invite Short-Listed Offerors to vendor demonstration/interviews. If interviews are scheduled with the Short-Listed Offerors, previous evaluation and rankings are not carried forward. For the purpose of selecting a Preferred Offeror, the evaluation criteria will be given the following relative weights:

Additional meetings may be held to clarify issues or to address comments, as deemed appropriate. Proposers will be notified in advance of the time and format of such meetings.

6.5 AWARD PROCEDURE

Union County has the right to reject any or all proposals, to engage in further negotiations with any Company submitting a proposal, and/or to request additional information or clarification. The County is not obligated to accept the lowest cost proposal. The County may accept the proposal that best serves its needs, as determined by County officials in their sole discretion.

The County reserves the right to make an award without further discussion of the proposals received. Therefore, it is important that the proposal be submitted initially on the most favorable terms.

A proposal may be rejected if it is incomplete. Union County may reject any or all proposals and may waive any immaterial deviation in a proposal.

More than one proposal from an individual, Offeror, partnership, corporation or association under the same or different names, will not be considered.

The County reserves the right to enter into negotiations with the top ranked Offeror. However, negotiations with the top ranked Offeror does not signify a commitment by Union County to execute a contract or to continue discussions. The County reserves the right to terminate negotiations at any time and for any reason.

The County may select and enter into negotiations with the next most advantageous Proposer if negotiations with the initially chosen Proposer are not successful.

The award shall be made in the best interest of the County. This Request for Proposal is not subject to any competitive bidding requirements of North Carolina law. The County reserves the right to accept other than the most financially advantageous proposal.

The award document will be a Contract incorporating, by reference, all the requirements, terms and conditions of the solicitation and the Offeror's proposal as negotiated.

6.6 CONFLICT CERTIFICATION

The Offeror must certify that it does not have any actual or potential conflicts of interest with, or adversarial litigation against the County or any of its officers or employees. During the course of the contractual relationship formed pursuant to this solicitation, any such conflict of interest, whether newly arising or newly discovered, must be disclosed to the County in writing.

7 GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS 7.1 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The contract award will have an initial term of three (3) years with two (2) one (1) year renewal options at the County's discretion, pending annual budget approval.

By mutual agreement, any contract which may be awarded pursuant to this RFP, may be renewed in accordance with the description above at agreed prices with all other terms and conditions remaining the same.

Union County has the right to reject any or all proposals, to engage in further negotiations with any Company submitting a proposal, and/or to request additional information or clarification. The County is not obligated to accept the lowest cost proposal. The County may accept that proposal that best serves its needs, as determined by County officials in their sole discretion.

All payroll taxes, liability and worker's compensation are the sole responsibility of the Offeror. The Offeror understands that an employer/employee relationship does not exist under this contract.

All proposals submitted in response to this request shall become the property of Union County and as such, may be subject to public review.

7.2 CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

The contents of this Proposal and the commitments set forth in the selected Proposal(s) shall be considered contractual obligations, if a contract ensues. Failure to accept these obligations may result in cancellation of the award. All legally required terms and

conditions shall be incorporated into final contract agreements with the selected Service Provider(s).

7.3 SUB-CONTRACTOR/PARTNER DISCLOSURE
