**7 RHYMING**  
Point to a body part and think of words that rhyme. *(like head and bed)*

**14 COUNTING**  
Count the pages in your child's favorite book.

**21 TALKING**  
Talk about a feeling you felt today. What made you happy or sad?

**28 READING**  
It is National Superhero Day, Find a book about heroes.

**1 RHYMING**  
Say as many words as you can that rhyme with "rain".

**8 FREE**  
It is National Library Week! Start it off with a trip to the library.

**15 TALKING**  
Talk about foods that are green. *(make a list of your favorites)*

**22 READING**  
Happy Earth Day! Go read outside.

**29 WRITING**  
Write your child's name and talk about each letter and sound.

**2 COUNTING**  
Draw circles, squares, and triangles on the sidewalk with chalk. Count how many there are of each shape.

**9 TALKING**  
Use new describing words today. *(like "gigantic" instead of "big")*

**16 READING**  
Look out for letters on license plates today. How many can you see?

**23 WRITING**  
Have your child trace an alphabet letter using their finger, than a crayon or pencil.

**30 SINGING**  
Listen to music and sing along.



**3 TALKING**  
Talk about the ways you can be kind to your neighbors.

**10 READING**  
Show your child reading is important to you too. Get caught reading.

**17 WRITING**  
Use crayons or markers to write the color words. *(Use the blue crayon to write "blue")*

**24 SINGING**  
Sing Itsy Bitsy Spider. *(Lyrics on back ➡)*



**4 READING**  
Collect pictures your child has drawn and staple them together. Ask you child to tell you a story with the pictures.

**11 WRITING**  
Make a to do list with your child today. Sound out the words together.

**18 SINGING**  
Make up songs about what you are doing and sing together.

**25 PLAYING**  
Have a picnic for your child and their stuffed animals.

**5 WRITING**  
Make a word jar. Each day write a new word on a slip of paper and add it to the jar.

**12 SINGING**  
Sing a song in a low voice; sing it in a high voice; sing it fast; sing it slow.

**19 PLAYING**  
Play a board or card game with your child.

**26 COUNTING**  
Draw numbers on the sidewalk with chalk. Say the numbers as you jump on them.

**6 SINGING**  
Sing Did You Ever See a Bunny? *(Lyrics on back ➡)*

**13 PLAYING**  
Make a tent with sheets and furniture. Pretend to camp. What do you see and hear?

**20 COUNTING**  
Go for a walk. Take two big steps. Take three large steps. Count the steps from your door to the side walk.

**27 RHYMING**  
Gather items that rhyme like rice/ice or pan/fan/can. Use toys for more variety.

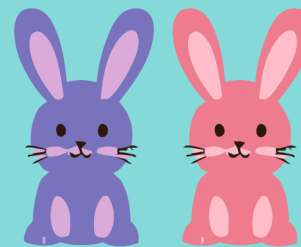
